<b>Position Summary</b>	<p>The primary role of the SRMO– Orthopaedics is, under direction and supervision, to review the needs of inpatients and outpatients and to provide appropriate care and services to secure optimum health outcomes.</p> <p>There is an expectation that this position will contribute to the Orthopaedic on-call roster as published with expectations of a 1 in 6 roster for weekdays and weekends.</p> <p>This position offers an opportunity for further Orthopaedic training and operative experience for a candidate considering an Orthopaedic career in a contemporary setting supported by the latest equipment at a brand new state of the art Level 5 facility.</p> <p>The SRMO provides clinical assessments, management advice, care of emergency admissions and works with inpatients as required and directed; performing any necessary operative procedures required for the care and treatment of such patients and the arrangement of patient admission and discharge processes.</p> <p>The SRMO will attend and assess patients in the Emergency Department and also provide operative care / assistance on patients in theatres during rostered hours and while on call.</p> <p>The SRMOs are supervised by senior medical staff to ensure they are entrusted with responsibilities commensurate within their capabilities. The Head of the Department or their delegate will conduct the mid-term and end-of-term assessments and provide feedback where appropriate.</p>

Currently registered or eligible for registration with the Medical Board of Australia.</li> <li>• Demonstrated a minimum two years' post graduate clinical practice in the last 3 years.</li> <li>• Demonstrated progress towards career goals in Orthopaedic Surgery.</li> <li>• Demonstrated clinical competency and an ability to work independently within a supervised complex clinical environment utilising excellent clinical skills, judgment and expertise.</li> <li>• Demonstrated excellent written and verbal communication skills, time management and problem solving skills in the clinical setting as part of a multidisciplinary team.</li> <li>• Demonstrated commitment to quality improvement, patient safety and risk management and evidence of sound working knowledge of legal and ethical obligations governing medical practice.</li> </ul>

<b>Key Responsibility 1</b>	<b>Clinical duties/ performance</b>
<b>Performance Criteria 1</b>	<p>The medical practitioner is responsible for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ward Rounds: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Notification to the appropriate VMO / Staff Specialist of patients requiring acute admission to hospital under their care;</li> <li>- Organisation of admissions and discharges (including discharge summaries)</li> <li>- Organisation of waiting lists and theatre lists;</li> <li>- Assessment and formulation of a management plan for patients presenting for care;</li> <li>- Communication of assessment and management decisions to appropriate VMO / Staff Specialist, junior medical staff and other staff involved in the patients' care;</li> <li>- Communication with the patient, or with immediate family where appropriate, about the patient's condition and management;</li> <li>- Ensuring that accurate and relevant patient documentation exists;</li> <li>- Communicating and coordinating effectively with other health professionals in regard to management plans, diagnostic requests and consultations;</li> <li>- Regular review of patient progress and communication of any significant changes in the patient's condition to the VMO / Staff Specialist and nursing staff;</li> <li>- Initiation of change to the management plan within limitations set out by agreement with the VMO / Staff Specialist;</li> <li>- Management of unstable patients and ensuring an adequate handover to after-hours medical staff;</li> <li>- Supervision and teaching of students and junior medical officers attached to the department;</li> <li>- Undertake regular rounds of their patients during a shift.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Provide medical care to patients under the direction of the senior medical staff according to the roster developed and published by the Junior Medical Officer Unit in consultation with the Head of Department.</li> <li>• Liaises and consults with senior medical staff (being consultants, visiting medical officers, career medical practitioners/officers and other service providers) concerning overall patient management.</li> <li>• Under direction, provide appropriate surgical care to patients and assist more senior doctors with complex cases.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure the treating specialist is appraised of all significant changes in any patient under their care.</li> <li>• Support the development of an evidence-based medicine (EBM) approach to all patients.</li> <li>• Attending and actively participate in service meetings, departmental quality assurance meetings and clinical audit activities when organised by Heads of Departments or Clinical Directors.</li> <li>• Proactively deal with Patient Safety; Clinical Risk (including involvement in Mortality Review), Quality Improvement, customer/ patient relations and Infection Control measures as they relate to patients under their care; including the specific notification of all incidents or near-misses relating to patients under their care.</li> <li>• Manages patients in emergency, outpatient and inpatient settings in accordance with policies and procedures of Northern Beaches Hospital and on the instruction of senior medical staff.</li> <li>• Liaises with patients, family and other representatives as required to facilitate patient management.</li> <li>• Supports nursing staff and other health professionals in the performance of their clinical duties</li> </ul>
<b>Key Responsibility 2</b>	<b>Administration &amp; Communication</b>
<b>Performance Criteria 2</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The clinical well-being of patients is assured at all times, and care is delivered in a sensitive and timely manner, respecting patients' confidentiality, privacy, autonomy, diversity including gender, age religion and culture.</li> <li>• Maintain quality patient medical records according to health service protocols and the policies of Northern Beaches Hospital.</li> <li>• Accurately convey relevant information and explanations to patients, families, colleagues and other health care professionals.</li> <li>• Following discussion and agreement with senior medical staff, discuss relevant information with patients and their families in a manner which encourages their participation in informed decision-making</li> <li>• Maintain effective interpersonal relationships with all members of the multidisciplinary team.</li> <li>• Review any patient, if specifically requested by senior medical staff or After Hours Manager, should there be any concerns regarding the condition or well-being of the patient.</li> <li>• If senior medical staff are unable to attend work through unforeseen circumstances (such as sickness) the Resident Medical Practitioner may need to assist with cover until a locum can be obtained, if possible.</li> <li>• Attend Morbidity and Mortality meetings and prepare /analyse/collate data within rostered hours.</li> </ul>
<b>Key Responsibility 3</b>	<b>Health Advocacy</b>
<b>Performance Criteria 3</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify the health needs of an individual patient.</li> <li>• Promote health maintenance of self and colleagues.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Take responsibility to ensure that when they are on duty, or on call, that they are at optimal level of performance.</li> <li>Be aware of Australian Medical Association “safe working hours” documents and ensure they present themselves to work both mentally and physically capable of doing their job.</li> </ul>
<b>Key Responsibility 4</b>	<b>Training and Education</b>
<b>Performance Criteria 4</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The SRMO is required to maintain annual basic life support skills and bi-annual certification in advanced cardiac life support and provide evidence of its completion.</li> <li>The SRMO must attend hospital orientation, all mandatory training sessions provided by the hospital, be familiar with emergency and evacuation procedures, comply with Work Health and Safety requirements and comply with hospital objectives to prevent and minimise infection in every aspect of their work.</li> <li>The SRMO must provide documentation of their participation in ongoing professional development activities on a regular basis.</li> <li>The SRMO maintains an up-to-date knowledge of current treatments and work practices in treating critically unwell patients.</li> <li>Complete all mandatory training by the identified due date</li> </ul>
<b>Key Responsibility 5</b>	<b>Performance Appraisal</b>
<b>Performance Criteria 5</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A term appraisal will occur every 3 months.</li> <li>An end-of-term, appraisal will occur no later than 14 days prior to the end of the assignment.</li> <li>Appraisals will include assessment against the measures outlined in this position description and the performance appraisal form.</li> <li>The Resident Medical Practitioner will participate in continuing medical education (CME) activities.</li> <li>Regular meetings and consultation with Supervisor of Training / Head of Department / Clinical Director of Surgery / Medical Workforce Unit Management.</li> </ul>
<b>Key Responsibility 6</b>	<b>Workplace Health &amp; Safety</b>
